In 2018, Director Robert Gordon proposed a Fleet Management Apprenticeship Program to Commissioner Mereda Davis Johnson. A partnership be-



tween DeKalb County Fleet Management and Georgia Piedmont Technical College was forged. The program came to fruition and was launched on September 4, 2018.

Currently, there are six apprentices (pictured above) participating in the 2-year program, working 40 hours per week, while remaining enrolled in a full-time automotive program at a 2-year technical college. Upon completion of the program, apprentices can apply for open Technician III positions.



On December 9, 2021, Imaan Lawton-Edwards (pictured left) became the first female in DeKalb County Fleet Management to be assigned to the automotive shop as a technician. Imaan is one of six technicians currently participating in the Fleet Management Apprenticeship Program.
