


### A New Generation of Fleet Managers

### Safety First.... Roll With the Heat



The recent wave of extreme heat in our part of the country should remind us as fleet managers that there are many ways that weather extremes affect the performance, functionality and safety of vehicles and equipment. One of the most important of these is the effect of excessive heat and temperature fluctuation on tires.

Tires are one of the most important and costly items we depend on to keep our fleets functional. A tire failure causes not only downtime, but additional repair expense and the possibility of safety situation. Depending on the tire's position and type of failure, you could incur damage in addition to the tire itself to components such as the vehicle body, air/brake lines, wiring, lights and installed equipment. Additionally, if the tire is in the steering position, the possibility of an accident and a life safety issue come into play.

The most common cause of tire failure is under inflation. Many times this is due to a slow leak caused from an unnoticed puncture by some type of foreign object. It can also, however, be caused by under inflation simply due to extreme fluctuation in ambient air temperatures. On June 27, 2012, we recorded a temperature of 58 degrees at 6am. By June 29, 2012, at 4pm we recorded a temperature of 105 degrees. This type of temperature swing in a short time period can cause changes in tire pressure. While this is addressed in many of our newer fleet vehicles which employ on-board tire pressure monitoring systems, there are still many units in service that do not have these systems.

In order to manage fleet costs and safety by limiting tire failures consider the following:

- Always gauge check tire pressure during PM services and pre-trip inspections, the "bump" test is inaccurate at best
- Cover the importance of regular tire monitoring with technicians and mechanics at regular safety meetings, TPM's do fail
- Replace worn tires at the appropriate tread depth and condition, getting that "one more" trip may cost you money not save it

So, please use these few days of extreme heat to serve as a reminder of how important proper tire management is to the performance and safety of our fleets.
